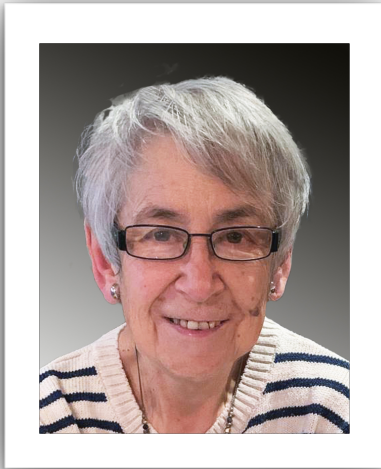

The concept of intergenerational practice: learning in later life and cultural diversity.

Summary:

Lifelong learning has the potential to promote social inclusion and cohesion within ageing populations. Within this framework, the idea of intergenerational learning has particular appeal; but what does it mean in practice? It will be argued that we need better insights into cognitive changes as people grow older and also to address issues of knowledge transmission and power and the need for cultural sensitivity in intergenerational learning.
